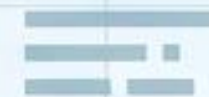

Ground Control: Navigating Morning Traffic

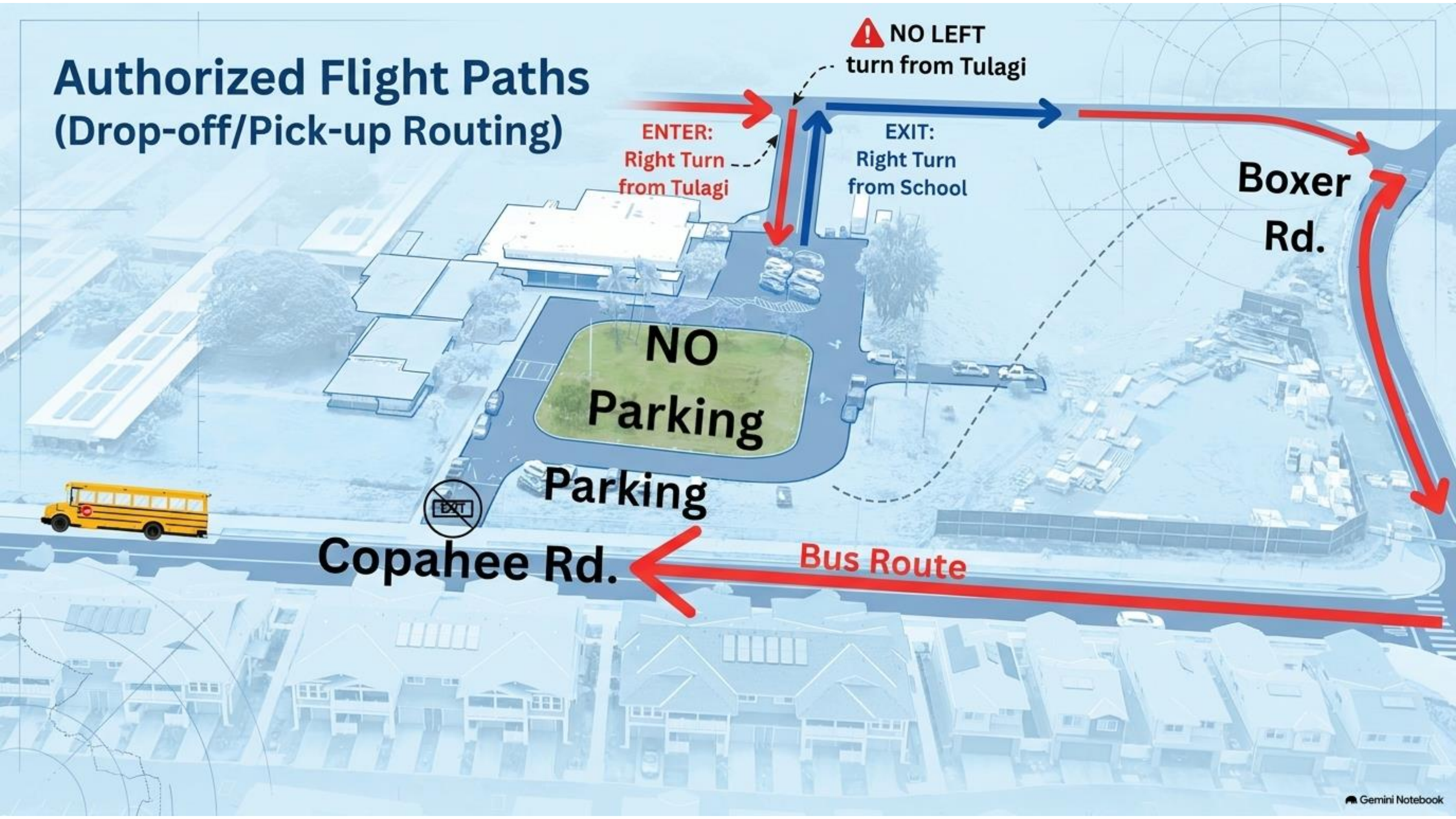
3 Golden Rules of Drop-Off

- 1. Stay in Your Vehicle:** The drop-off lane is an active moving zone. If your child needs help unbuckling, please use a parking stall.
- 2. Pull All the Way Forward:** Drive as far down the lane as possible before letting your child out to prevent main road backups.
- 3. Passenger-Side Exit Only:** For safety, children must only exit and enter on the curbside, away from moving traffic.

State Mandate

New HDOE statewide policy requires a shift in device management.



Powered Down

Phones and smartwatches must be turned completely OFF (not just on silent/vibrate) upon arrival.



Stowed Away

Devices remain hidden in backpacks from the first bell to the last bell.

Unlocks a focused, safe, and engaging learning environment free from digital distraction.
